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Subject: a matter of national importance

Dear Prime Minister Harper,

I have received your e-mail letter dated January 22, 2006 in response to my letter of December 11, 2005 addressed to both you and to Paul Martin. (For the record, despite two e-mails and then a registered letter dated December 23, 2005 requesting acknowledgement from Mr. Martin's office, such acknowledgement of this correspondence which was co-addressed to Mr. Martin has not been received.)

To the point of your response (our correspondence is attached below). To e-mail me on January 22, 2006 and state that, because of the election to be held on January 23, 2006 you would not be able to respond, is not sufficient. To then change topics and follow in your e-mail with irrelevant paragraphs describing the corruption of the Liberal Party and how the Conservatives are ethically superior is politics-as-usual regarding a matter which is of critical importance to Canadians and urgently requires immediate attention, planning, and constructive action.

With regard to the substance of the article that I penned and forwarded in the December 11, 2005 correspondence (see: <http://www.safehaven.com/article-4242.htm>), after decades of failed monetarist policy by U.S., Canadian, and European central banks, we stand now at the cusp of an inflationary economic dislocation which will have a lasting and destructive impact on U.S. and Canadian society for generations to come.

Despite its repeated failure throughout history, the concept of attempted control of the economy via manual central planning of interest rates and the amount of money in the economy has been attractive to western governments as it allowed both over-promising on social programmes and the financing of military wars of adventure via government bonds issuances whose value was periodically consumed with bouts of inflation that are the hallmark of the central banking monetary system as most recently established in 1913 in Canada and the U.S.

The current use of manipulation of the monetary system is inherently unjust in that it destroys the savings of seniors and pension funds with inflationary waves and causes investment manias followed by crashes (1929 stock market bubble and crash, 1989 Nikkei stock market and real estate bubble crash, the 2000 dot.com stock bubble correction followed now by a real estate bubble in Canada, the U.S., Europe, and Australia). Monetary manipulation by central banks which undervalues commodities and natural resources for protracted periods also results in over-consumption of resources and environmentally destructive practices in the commodities industry and leaves us now with completely mal-structured cities unprepared for the much higher energy prices to come. It has been accepted by our governments as the benefits of being able to stimulate the economy and spend on government initiatives followed by the destruction of value of outstanding debt bonds through inflation has been too attractive to successive governments over the past 93 years.

Causing further fallout on our citizens, in an attempt to contain consumer awareness of inflation and to limit increases in labour agreements and government entitlement programmes (e.g. Canada Pension Plan), both Statistics Canada and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, using statistical sleight of hand such as hedonic adjustments, geometric weighting of consumer goods baskets, under-weighting of shelter costs etc., currently understate inflation by approximately 3% creating both a false impression of healthy economic growth and limiting government costs. The destructive manias and corrections as a consequence of stimulating the economy with monetary expansion and lowering interest rates has long been predicted by "Austrian School" economists. However, since this school advocates a relatively fixed monetary base such as occurred under the gold standard which forces near term taxation to finance wars and government spending (irritating the electorate), their views have long been ignored by governments, central banks and the financial industry which benefits from our debt-based monetary creation which hides the bouts of inflation that consumes unsustainable government generated debt.

The recent inflation wave first manifested itself in the inflating dot.com stock market then in inflating real estate prices. We are currently in a nascent commodity inflationary wave which has been developing during the past 3 years with oil, natural gas, electricity, uranium, base metals, gold and silver, food stuffs already showing substantial price increases. Metals are now showing a parabolic increase in price which is accelerating and will be closely followed by oil, energy, and food price accelerations. What we face now is unique in history as we have real estate, stock, bond and derivatives markets in a bubble condition and the coming rise in interest rates will collapse these bubbles with a potentially devastating effect on our populations. These inflationary economic contractions (or "stagflation" as was termed the 1970s price inflation which was accompanied by an economic contraction) which are the result of the economic distortion and excessive debt levels that accompany monetary stimulus, have been predicted with exactitude by Austrian School economists.

Canada is in an extremely compromised position as 45% of our GDP is generated through trade with the U.S. while only 4% of US GDP is as a result of trade with Canada. The beginning of the economic correction will be accompanied by currency crises and will, in particular, cause the U.S. great pain as their ability to obtain foreign oil and commodities in return for promissory certificates such as U.S. Treasuries and currency will likely become extremely constricted. Our imbalanced trade position with the U.S. puts Canada (especially Ontario's economic engine) in a strategically vulnerable position and exposed to coercive tactics to gain access to Canada's much needed energy and other natural resources.

Prime Minister Harper, immediate ameliorative and preparatory action is required to prepare Canadian society, and our monetary and economic system for the vesting consequences of the especially the reckless monetary policies of the past decade under Federal Reserve Chairman Greenspan which were emulated by Canadian, European and Australian central banks. These preparations go far beyond placing a garrison of Canadian troops in each of our major cities and the recently announced hiring of 2,000 additional RCMP officers per year.

During the past several years as Canada's ship of state has visibly headed toward imminent economic peril, Canadians have been treated to Parliamentarians' (employees of the Canadian people) and our political parties' engagement in repeated partisan accusations and recriminations, endless discussion and debate about a same sex marriage bill, shameless public elevation of the personal lives of politicians in exchange for media exposure, and other matters which pale in comparison to the immediacy and impact of these urgent economic matters. While this may seem justifiable to our members of parliament, it ignores the peril in which our country finds itself and consumes valuable time which is required to prepare for what will be an historic resetting of our monetary, economic and social fabric in Canada.

Canada requires immediate and cooperative planning by all levels of government and the addressee Parliamentarians to mitigate the consequences of the inflationary correction that we face.

I trust that you will give your attentions to this matter and I await your detailed response to this letter.

In closing, I would like to add that it appears that heightened tensions with Iran are being initiated by the U.S. as a covering device for the onset of the visibly accelerating inflationary wave which we see developing in the metals and energy markets. It is an inflationary wave that has its origins in the monetary policy of our central banks not in Iran's nuclear programme. It is my hope that Canada remains constructively focused on the root causes, mitigation, and recovery from the economic dislocation that approaches.
